- a) Originally from Ur of the Chaldeans      Genesis 11:27
- b) He took Abram and his grandson Lot to go to Canaan      Genesis 11:28
- c) They came to Haran and dwelt there      Genesis 11:31
- d) Terah died at Haran      Genesis 11:32

2. Abram left Haran at 75 years      Genesis 12:4

- a) God called him to leave Haran and to go to Canaan      Genesis 12:1
- b) Many experiences and many deep lessons (75-86 Years)
  - i) Famine in Canaan      Genesis 12:10
  - ii) Going to Egypt      Genesis 12:10
  - iii) God's protection in Egypt      Genesis 12:10-20
  - iv) Gaining wealth      Genesis 13:2
  - v) Problems with Lot
