介绍

1. 证道系列 — “主的受难与复活”
 - a. 阅读《马太福音 26-28》，并总结《马太福音》的整体信息
 - b. 学习关于主耶稣基督受难与复活那深深打动人心的教训
 - c. 受挑战来寻求对主耶稣及祂的救恩更深刻的珍惜
2. 我们今天的焦点 — “门徒都离开祂逃走了” 《马太福音 26：31-35, 47-56》

主对门徒的警告

1. 主耶稣预先警告 《马太福音 26：31-32》
 - a. 在祂与门徒最后的晚餐
 - b. 他们将因耶稣而跌倒
 - i. 这是先知撒迦利亚的预言 参照《撒迦利亚书 13：7》

“我要击打牧人，羊就分散了。”
 - ii. 主耶稣受背叛，被逮捕便应验这预言
 - iii. 这也导致门徒们在信实中跌倒并逃走，离弃主耶稣
 - c. 祂会在复活之后，在门徒之前到达加利利
2. 其他门徒与彼得不幸的反应 《马太福音 26：33-35》
 - a. 彼得忽视了主耶稣的警告
 - b. 他甚至说自己即使死，也不会不认主耶稣
 - c. 其他的门徒也有如同彼得的自信，但错误的回应

捉拿主耶稣

1. 主耶稣被捉拿 《马太福音 26：47-49》
 - a. 加略人犹大来到主耶稣所在的院子里
 - b. 有许多人带着刀棒，从祭司长和长老们那里与他同来
 - i. 犹大到耶稣跟前与祂亲嘴
 - ii. 这是捉拿主耶稣的暗号
2. 欣赏主耶稣的特质
 - a. 祂的冷静 《马太福音 26：50》
 - i. 祂无惧地站出来面对来捉祂的人 参照《约翰福音 18：4-6》

- ii. 祂将犹大称为“朋友”，没有对他的出卖表达愤怒
 - b. 祂的恩惠与怜悯 《马太福音 26: 51-52》
 - i. 彼得拔出自己带的刀，削掉大祭司仆人的耳朵
参照《约翰福音 18: 10》
 - ii. 主耶稣责骂彼得如此暴力的行为
 - iii. 主耶稣仁慈地治好那仆人的耳朵 参照《路加福音 22: 51》
 - c. 祂对天父旨意的遵从与信实 《马太福音 26: 53-56》
 - i. 祂说自己被捕是为了应验经上的预言，成就天父的计划
 - ii. 祂当可以祈求众多天使来拯救祂
 - iii. 祂提醒所有人祂每日所教的，也提到无须对祂使用武力
 - iv. 祂自愿让他们捉住，是为遵从天父的旨意
3. 门徒们的软弱
- a. 他们渴望对主耶稣忠诚
 - b. 他们甚至诚心、大胆地宣称自己对耶稣的忠诚
 - c. 但在被考验的当下
 - i. 他们被恐惧克服
 - ii. 他们软弱的信心被动摇
 - iii. 他们全离弃主耶稣而逃 《马太福音 26: 56》

给予我们的重要教训

1. 向主耶稣学习怎么面对巨大的挑战
 - a. 通过祈祷
 - b. 通过冷静，平静中的力量
 - c. 通过恩惠与怜悯，即使对待敌方
 - d. 通过信心与对天父的遵从
2. 学习如何不重犯门徒的错误
 - a. 听从主的教导与警告
 - b. 不把我们信心当做理所当然（门徒们的自信反导致他们失败）
 - c. 培养我们的信心，在生活的不同考验中实践这信心

Text: Matthew 26:31-35, 47-56

INTRODUCTION

1. Pulpit Series – “The Death and Resurrection of the Lord”
 - a. Reading Matthew 26-28 and concluding the Gospel of Matthew
 - b. To learn poignant lessons concerning the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ
 - c. To be challenged to find a deeper appreciation of the Lord Jesus and our salvation in Him
2. Our focus today – “All the disciples forsook Him and left”
Matthew 26:31-35, 47-56

THE LORD’S WARNING TO HIS DISCIPLES

1. The forewarning of the Lord Jesus Matthew 26:31-32
 - a. During His last supper with His disciples
 - b. That they will be made to stumble because of Him
 - i. This was prophesied by the prophet Zechariah cf. Zechariah 13:7
‘I will strike the Shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.’
 - ii. The betrayal and arrest of the Lord Jesus would fulfil prophecy
 - iii. It would also cause His disciples to flee and stumble in their faith
 - c. He would then go before them to Galilee after He has been raised
2. The unfortunate response of Peter and the other Disciples Matthew 26:33-35
 - a. Peter dismissed the warning of the Lord Jesus
 - b. He even claimed that he would not deny the Lord Jesus even if he were to die
 - c. The other disciples followed Peter’s confident but wrong response

THE ARREST OF THE LORD JESUS

1. The arrest of the Lord Jesus Matthew 26:47-49
 - a. Judas Iscariot came to the Garden where the Lord Jesus was
 - b. With a great multitude of armed men from the chief priests and elders
 - i. He went up to the Lord Jesus and kissed Him
 - ii. As a sign to seize the Lord Jesus
2. Appreciating the Lord Jesus
 - a. His calmness Matthew 26:50
 - i. He stepped forward (fearlessly) to meet those who were after Him
cf. John 18:4-6
 - ii. He addressed Judas as “friend” and did not react in anger to his betrayal
 - b. His grace and mercy Matthew 26:51-52
 - i. Peter reacted by striking and cutting off the ear of the servant of the high priest cf. John 18:10
 - ii. The Lord Jesus rebuked Peter for such violence
 - iii. The Lord Jesus graciously healed the injured man cf. Luke 22:51
 - c. His faith and obedience in the Father’s will Matthew 26:53-56
 - i. He spoke of His arrest as a fulfilment of Scripture and the Father’s plan
 - ii. He could have prayed for legions of angels to deliver Him
 - iii. He reminded all that He taught daily, and there was no reason for such violence against Him
 - iv. He allowed Himself to be arrested in obedience to the Father’s will
3. The weakness of the Disciples
 - a. They had desired to remain faithful to the Lord Jesus
 - b. They even spoke sincerely and boldly of their commitment to Him

- c. Yet in this hour of being tested
 - i. They were overcome by fear
 - ii. Their weak faith faltered
 - iii. All of them forsook the Lord Jesus and fled
Matthew 26:56

IMPORTANT LESSONS FOR US ALL

1. Learning from how the Lord Jesus faced great challenges
 - a. With prayer
 - b. With calmness and strength
 - c. With grace and mercy even to His enemies
 - d. With faith and obedience to the Father
2. Learning to avoid the mistakes the Disciples made
 - a. By heeding what the Lord says and warns
 - b. By not taking the strength of our faith for granted
(the self-confidence of the Disciples led to their failure)
 - c. By cultivating our faith and exercising it in every circumstance of life
