To the Chief Musician. Set to "Lily of the Testimony." A Michtam of David. For teaching. When he fought against Mesopotamia and Syria of Zobah, and Joab returned and killed twelve thousand Edomites in the Valley of Salt.

- 1. God has spoken
- 2. He has spoken in holiness
- 3. The sovereign authority of God
 - a) He rejoices in what He has decided on
 - b) God is sovereign over all nations

4. Significant regions named: a) Shechem i) Associated with Abraham Genesis 12:6-7 ii) Rape of Dinah by a man called Shechem Genesis 34 iii) Capital of the Northern kingdom 1 Kings 12:1 b) Valley of Succoth i) Associated with Jacob on his return to Canaan Genesis 33:17 ii) Wrested from King Sihon and given to Gad later Joshua 13:27 c) The tribes of Israel i) Gilead is Mine (East of the River Jordan) ii) Manasseh is Mine iii) Ephraim is the helmet of My head iv) Judah is My lawgiver d) Nations outside Israel i) Moab It is only God's washpot; ii) Edom "Over Edom I will cast My shoe" iii) Philistia

Philistia will be conquered

Israel may shout in triumph because of God

- 2. Help is to be found in the LORD
 - a) God's help is needed
 - b) God must go with the army of Israel
 - c) Reliance on help from man would end in futility
 - d) With God's help
 - i) Israel will do valiantly
 - ii) It is God Himself who treads down enemies
