Psalm 81:5-7

- 1. The Passover Feast is in mind
 - a) This was a Feast that was established
 - b) This was a Testimony of what God did when Israel was in Egypt
 - i) Israel had to learn the Egyptian language
 - ii) He had a great burden to bear on his shoulders
 - iii) There were many baskets to carry
- 2. The children of Israel had called upon the LORD
- 3. The LORD had responded
 - a) He delivered Israel
 - b) He answered mightily ("thunder"

c) God also tested Israel at Meribah (Numbers 20)
