² which He promised before through His prophets in the Holy Scriptures,

³ concerning His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the seed of David according to the flesh,

⁴ and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.
