2. David as king

- a) His understanding was that the LORD was King
- b) He was at best the regent of the Lord
- c) His prayers referred to God as King

i) My King and my God Psalm 5:2

ii) The Messiah as King Psalm 2:6

3. Revelation of the Eternal Kingdom

- a) An everlasting kingdom Daniel 7:14
- b) The Son of Man Daniel 7:13
