 - i) Sheep
 - ii) Shepherd's heart
 - iii) Sheep without a shepherd
- 2. Response of the Lord Jesus
 - a) He taught them Mark 6:34
 - b) Many things Mark 6:34
 - i) The Kingdom of God
 - ii) Basic truths (God, Faith, Himself etc)
- 3. The Multitudes
 - a) Attitude and approach of the disciples "Send them away" Matthew 14:15; Mark 6:35-36; Luke 9:12

1. The multitudes asked to sit down in groups in hundreds and fifties Mark 6:40

- 2. Performing the miracle
 - a) Looking up to heaven
 - b) Taking up the loaves and fish
 - c) Blessed the loaves and fish
 - d) Fed the 5000 Mark 6:44
- 3. Leftover
 - a) Twelve baskets of fragments (loaves)
 - b) And fish Mark 6:43

John the Baptiser had prepared the way for the Messiah to come,
