### THE TRANSFIGURATION OF JESUS

- 1. Time
- a) Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John, and led them up on a high mountain Mark 9:2
- b) Now it came to pass, about eight days after these sayings, that He took Peter, John, and James and went up on the mountain to pray Luke 9:28
- c) Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, led them up on a high mountain by themselves Matthew 17:1
- d) Discrepancy:
  - i) Six days (Matthew, Mark)
  - ii) Eight days (Luke)
- 2. Venue

On a high mountain (Probably Mount Hermon... overlooking Caesarea Philippi)

3. Present

Peter, James and John

- 4. Transfigured (Greek metamorphite Aorist passive) "to be transformed" Mark 9:2
- a) Clothes became exceedingly white

Mark 9:3

b) His face shone like the sun

Matthew 17:2

- 5. Significance of the Transfiguration
- a) The Son of Man in His glory
- b) A glimpse of the Glorious King
- c) A glimpse of the glorious nature of the kingdom of God in the Transfiguration of Christ
- d) The significance is reflected in 2 Peter 1:16-18
  - i) Reference is made to the Transfiguration
  - ii) The disciples heard the voice of God
  - iii) They were eyewitnesses of Christ's majesty
  - iv) He received honour and glory from God
- e) The Transfiguration of Christ was in part a fulfilment of Christ's cryptic statement (Mark 9:1)
  - i) Some... Peter, James and John
  - ii) They would not taste death till they had seen the kingdom of God come in power
