### **INTRODUCTION TO THE STUDY OF 1 JOHN**

#### BACKGROUND TO THE LIFE OF JOHN THE DISCIPLE

- 1. John was a disciple of John the baptist (John 1:35-39)
  - a. One of the two disciples who stood next to John the Baptist
  - b. John the Baptist introduced Jesus to John
    - "Behold the Lamb of God!" John 1:36
  - c. They heard Him speak and followed Him
  - d. They had a special interaction with Jesus
  - e. They remained with Jesus in His house
- 2. John was hot-tempered (Mark 3:17, Luke 9:52-55)
  - a. Known as sons of thunder with his brother James
  - b. When the Samaritans did not receive Jesus, they were angry
  - c. They asked Jesus whether He wanted them to call fire from heaven to consume them
  - d. The Lord Jesus rebuked them for their wrong manner of spirit
  - e. Character still had to be dealt with
  - f. No full understanding yet
- 3. He was the disciple whom Jesus loved (John 13:23-26)
  - a. He was leaning on the bosom of Jesus
  - b. When Peter wanted to know who would betray Jesus, he asked John to asked Him
  - c. Jesus told John that it was the person whom He would give a piece of bread
  - d. Jesus gave the bread to Judas
- 4. John's testimony of Jesus' death (John 19:35-37)
  - a. He has seen the Lord Jesus death and testified that it is true
  - b. He knows that He is telling the truth
  - c. So that we may believe

- d. The Scriptures were fulfilled
- 5. John seeing the empty tomb and believed what Mary said (John 20:3-10)
  - a. He ran to the tomb
  - b. He saw the empty tomb with the linen cloths and the handkerchief folded by itself.
- 6. John and the disciples saw Jesus in person (John 20:20-21)
  - a. They were glad that they saw Jesus
  - b. They were filled with the Holy Spirit
- 7. John and Peter wanted to go back fishing (John 21)
  - a. John was specially restored to the Lord Jesus
  - b. John would be the only disciple would not be martyred
