SEEKING FRUITFULNESS IN LIFE

- 1. Because it glorifies God the Father (John 15: 8)
- 2. Because it shows that we are abiding in Christ (John 15: 5)
- 3. So that we may fulfil the purpose for which we have been chosen and appointed (John 15: 16)

ONE KEY ASPECT THAT LEADS TO FRUITFULNESS: THE WORD OF GOD

- 1. Mentioned by the Lord Jesus in John 15 (John 15: 7)
- 2. Singled out by Him in the context of his teaching ministry in Luke 8
- 3. Why singled out?
 - a. Because this is where many fail
 - b. Few are able to speak of keeping God's Word till fruitfulness is seen

PROBLEMS THAT RESULT IN UNFRUITFULNESS

- 1. The Word of God is not given enough attention
 - a. The Word of God is likened to a seed (Luke 8: 11)
 A seed contains all the potential for fruitfulness
 - b. But it is set aside (falls by the wayside)
 - c. The devil's involvement (Luke 8: 12)
 - i. He comes
 - ii. He takes away the Word out of their heart
- 2. The heart is not right
 - a. Superficial heart (Luke 8: 13)
 - i. Initial joy
 - ii. No roots
 - b. Worldly heart (Luke 8: 14)
 - i. Worldly cares grow side by side with the Word of God
 - ii. Ultimately, these worldly cares choke the Word of God
 - iii. No fruit is brought to maturity

THE CHALLENGE TO SEEK FRUITFULNESS

- 1. Seek the Lord for a noble and good heart (Luke 8: 15)
- 2. Determined to keep the Word of God (Luke 8: 15)
 - a. Keep

Cf. Psalm 119: 33 – 40

- i. To have it
- ii. To hold on to it
- b. With patience (perseverance)
