THE IMAGERY OF THE LAMP

- 1. A common household item
- 2. Function
 - a. Used every evening as a source of light
 - b. Useful and necessary
- 3. Meaning
 - a. The source of light is obvious
 - i. The Lord Jesus
 - ii. The Word of God
 - b. But the light that comes from the Lord must be made personal to us
 - i. For us to apply
 - ii. For us to use
 - c. We are to shine for the Lord!

A WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT TO SHINE FOR THE LORD

1. To be distinctive in the way we live

"No one, when he has lit a lamp, covers it with a vessel or puts it under a bed..." (Luke 8: 16)

- a. Light is distinct from darkness
 - i. A lamp will always shine in the darkness
 - ii. It is not meant to be covered or hidden
- b. Encouragement
 - i. Don't be afraid to be different from those in the world
 - ii. Be distinct as a light that shines in the darkness
- 2. To be <u>drawn</u> to the Lord Jesus and His Words

"Therefore, take heed how you hear. For whoever has, to him more will be given..." (Luke 8: 18)

- a. If we are truly saved
 - i. We are naturally drawn to the light of the Lord Jesus (John 1: 4-5)

- ii. He will continuously shine His light on us
- b. We are drawn to Him and His Words
 - i. To hear
 - ii. To have
 - iii. To receive even more

APPLICATION TO YPG III

- 1. To shine for the Lord Jesus
 - a. Boldly
 - b. Without fear or shame
- 2. To keep your lamp bright and shining
 - a. This has to do with the Word of God
 - b. Hear, have, receive even more!
